Are killer whale populations increasing? Although there was some growth in the population in the 1970s and 1980s. Their population has drastically decreased. What's happening with killer whales? Over the last five years. Roughly 700 orca run-ins have been recorded. At least a half-dozen yachts, fishing vessels, and sailboats have sunk.



Are orcas endangered in 2024? We recommend the species maintain its endangered status in Washington. With 73 individuals remaining, southern resident killer whales, or orcas, are the only endangered population of killer whales in the U.S. What is killing killer whales? On top of these threats, orcas are dealing with another challenge, chemicals called polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs) contaminating the ocean.

The new iPhone 16 was released on September 20th. Apple's new phone is the first phone from Apple to have Apple intelligence which is applied to Apple's new Siri.

Apple Intelligence unlocks new ways for users to enhance their writing. With systemwide Writing Tools built into iOS 18, users can rewrite, proofread, and summarize text nearly everywhere they write, including Mail, Notes, Pages, and third-party apps. In the Notes and Phone apps, users can also record, transcribe, and summarize

audio. When a recording is started while on a call in the Phone app, participants are automatically notified, and once the call ends, Apple Intelligence generates a summary to recall key points. Apple's new iPhone 16 and iPhone 16 Plus are beautiful and built to last. iPhone holds its value longer than any other smartphone thanks to its industry-leading durability, including the strong back glass, a water- and dust-resistant design, regular software updates, and 2x tougher than glass on any other iPhone.

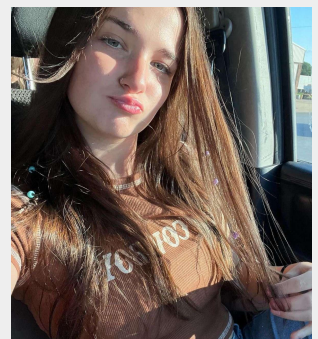

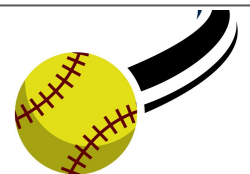
Fastpitch Senior Night
